Comal County Crime Stoppers sponsors: Turn in a Dealer Night

Residents all over Comal County and the surrounding New Braunfels area are invited to call the Crime Stoppers Hotline on Thursday evening (10-26-2006) to report drug-dealing activities in their communities.

This special night coincides with Red Ribbon Week, October 23- 31, 2006. Of course, the Hotline is open 24Hrs a day, seven days a week, but on this evening, special narcotics investigators will be on hand to man the phones.

State and local narcotics investigators, who will sit at the site from 6PM to 9PM Thursday evening, are eager to receive calls of drug activities. No call is too trivial. Certain suspicious activities in your neighborhood could indicate the activities of drug dealing, manufacture, and use.

Using the Crime Stoppers program ensures that the caller will remain anonymous. There is no caller ID, and the lines are not recorded, so there is no way for the caller to be identified. If desired, each caller will be issued a tip number, and all transactions will be done with that number from that point on. Even the rewards payments, if approved by the board, are conducted in a way that the tipster is never identified.

#### Bexar County Commissioners traveled to Phoenix AZ to visit Sheriff's Arpaio's Tent City

To those of you that are not familiar with Joe Arpaio, he is the Maricopa County Sheriff in Arizona. He keeps getting elected over and over. The following is one of the reasons why.

Sheriff Joe Arpaio (in Arizona) who created the "tent city jail":

He has jail meals down to 40 cents a serving and charges the inmates for them.

He stopped smoking and porno magazines in the jails. Took away their weights. Cut off all but "G" movies.

He started chain gangs so the inmates could do free work on county and city projects.

Then he started chain gangs for women so he wouldn't get sued for discrimination.

He took away cable TV until he found out there was a federal court order that required cable TV for jails. So he hooked! up the cable TV again but only let in the Disney channel and the weather channel.

When asked why the weather channel he replied, so they will know how hot it's gonna be while they are working on my chain gangs.

He cut off coffee since it has zero nutritional value.

When the inmates complained, he told them, "This isn't the Ritz/Carlton. If you don't like it, don't come back."

He bought Newt Gingrich' lecture series on videotape that he pipes into the jails.

When asked by a reporter if he had any lecture series by a Democrat, he replied that a democratic lecture series might explain why a lot of the inmates were in his jails in the first place.

More on the Arizona Sheriff:

With temperatures being even hotter than usual in Phoenix (116 degrees just set a new record), the Associated Press reports: About 2,000 inmates living in a barbed-wire-surrounded tent encampment at the Maricopa County Jail have been given permission to strip down to their government-issued pink boxer shorts.

On Wednesday, hundreds of men wearing boxers were either curled up on their bunk beds or chatted in the tents, which reached 138 degrees inside the week before.

Many were also swathed in wet, pink towels as sweat collected on their chests and dripped down to their pink socks.

"It feels like we are in a furnace," said James Zanzot, an inmate who has lived in the tents for 1 year. "It's inhumane."

Joe Arpaio, the tough-guy sheriff who created the tent city and long ago started making his prisoners wear pink, and eat bologna sandwiches, is not one bit sympathetic.

He said Wednesday that he told all of the inmates:

"It's 120 degrees in Iraq and our soldiers are living in tents too, and they have to wear full battle gear, but they didn't commit any crimes, so shut your damned mouths!"

Way to go, Sheriff! Maybe if all prisons were like this one there would be a lot less crime and/or repeat offenders. Criminals should be punished for their crimes - not live in luxury until it's time for their parole, only to go out and commit another crime so they can get back in to live on taxpayers money and enjoy things taxpayers can't afford to have for themselves.

Sheriff Joe was just reelected as Sheriff in Maricopa County (Phoenix), Arizona.
